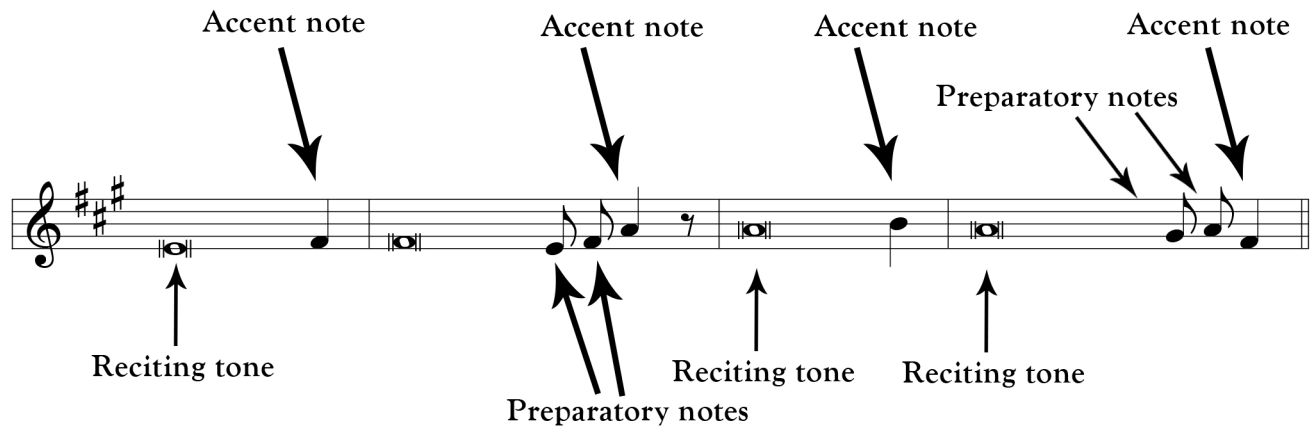

GUIDE TO SINGING PSALM VERSES



Note:

Syllables with normal type are sung on the reciting tone (unless they are preceded by a bold syllable on the same line).

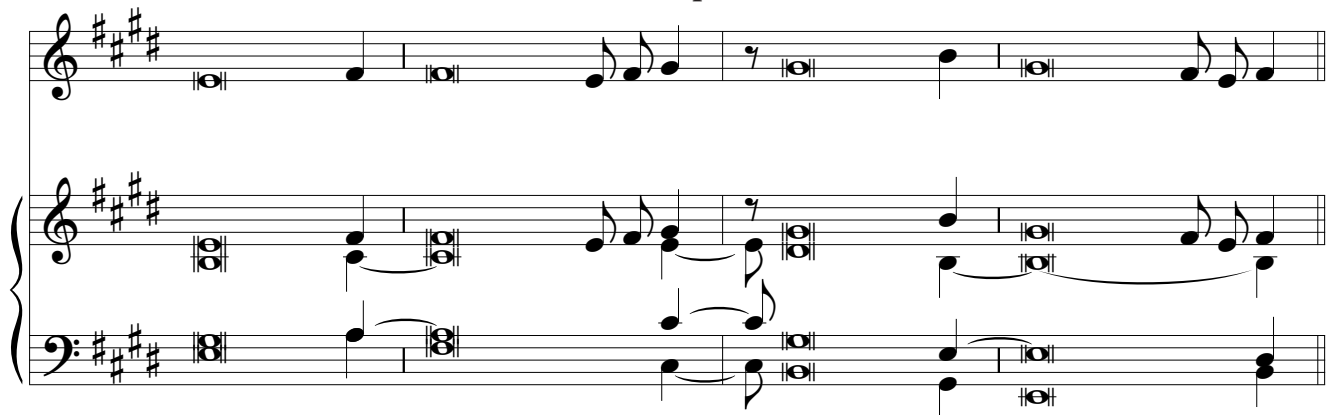
Syllables in **bold** (and syllables following on the same line) are sung on the accent note.

Syllables in *italics* are sung on the preparatory notes.

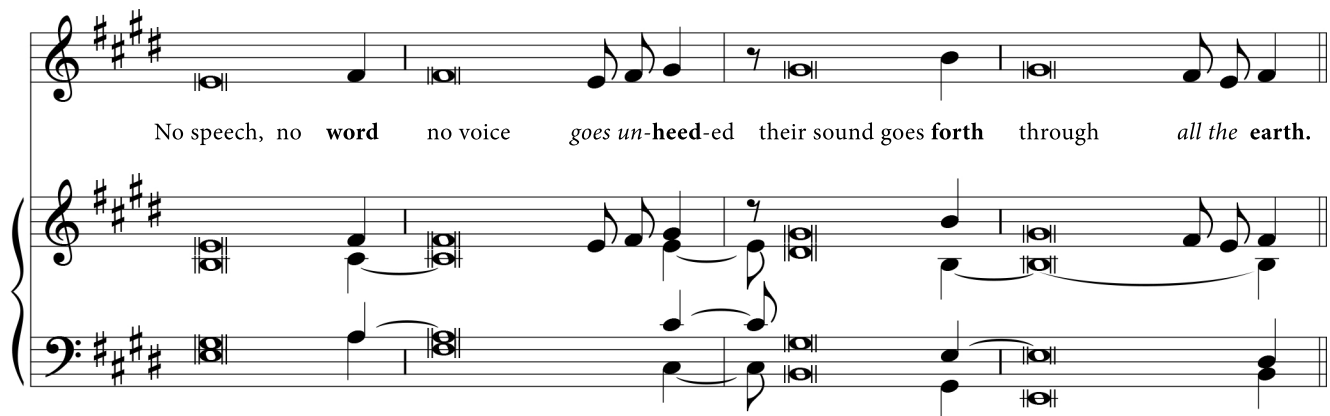
The line (“|”) symbolizes the departure from the reciting tone towards the accent.

The slash (“/”) symbolizes a pause, according to the sense of the text.

Example:



1. No speech, no | **word**,

CHANTING THE APPOINTED PSALMS OF ANTIPHONS

As time allows, it is praiseworthy — though not required — to chant selected verses of the appointed psalm of the Entrance and Communion Antiphons. The use of these psalm verses, however, is always optional.

There are a number of possibilities for using verses of the appointed psalm:

1. The Antiphon may be sung alone without any psalm verses.
2. The Antiphon may be repeated after each psalm verse, or group of verses.
3. The Antiphon may be sung at the beginning and conclusion of the selected psalm verses, without any intervening repetition.
4. The Glory be to the Father may be included before the final repetition of the Antiphon.
5. Psalm verses are provided set to both Latin and English psalm tones. These psalm settings may be used with any of the four possible settings of the Antiphons, as may be determined best for any given situation.

At the Entrance, care should be taken to end the chanting when the Celebrant arrives at the chair. In the same way, the Mass should not be delayed at the Offertory or Communion. The chanting may cover the sacred action, but should not prolong it unduly.
